A meeting of the City of Westminster Historic District Commission was held virtually via Zoom and broadcasted live on the City Facebook page on July 1, 2020, at 7:00 PM.

Call to Order

Chair McMasters read the statement of authority into the record.

Chair Kristen McMasters, Vice-Chair Dean Camlin, Commissioner Josh Ambrose, Commissioner Aaron Burroughs, and Commissioner Kevin Wagman were present. City staff Sandy Anderson, Andrea Gerhard, Andrew Gray, and Samantha Schlitzer were also present.

Approval of Minutes

Vice-Chair Camlin moved to approve the revised meeting summary for June 3, 2020. Commissioner Wagman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Chair McMasters opened New Business Item A – Historic District Commission Rules of Order and Procedure. Mr. Gray provided background information and presented the draft Rules of Order and Procedure. He added that staff took into consideration information contained in the Charter and Code of the City of Westminster, Maryland State Law, current Commission practice, and information from other historic district commissions in Maryland.

The Commission discussed detailed requirements they would like added to specific applications for different tax credits, rather than adding them to this policy document.

Vice-Chair Camlin moved to approve the draft Rules of Order and Procedure as presented. Commissioner Wagman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Chair McMasters opened New Business Item B – 2020 Commission Membership to the Maryland Association of Historic District Commissions. Mr. Gray noted that the City is renewing this membership at a cost of \$150.00.

Vice-Chair Camlin moved to approve the HDC membership renewal. Commissioner Wagman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Historic District Commission and Public Comments

Chair McMasters thanked Vice-Chair Camlin for his years of dedication to the HDC. His extensive knowledge of the field will be greatly missed.

Chair McMasters then reported on attending the Heart of the Civil War Heritage Committee meeting. She supported the committee in keeping applicant requirements to a minimum and not adding additional rules to deter interested parties.


BACKGROUND

According to Protecting Historic Properties: A Citizen’s Guide to Section 106 Review, published by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (NHPA), Congress established a comprehensive program to preserve the historical and cultural foundations of the nation as a living part of community life. Section 106 of the NHPA is crucial to that program because it requires consideration of historic preservation in the multitude of projects with federal involvement that take place across the nation every day. The Section 106 review process gives the public the opportunity to alert the federal government to the historic properties that we all value and influence decisions about projects that affect them.

AT&T Mobility, LLC, the Applicant, is proposing to locate communication antennas on an existing water tower located along the northern terminus of 41st Street at 2 College Avenue (SDAT# 07-004141).



The subject property is zoned R-10,000 Residential. The existing water tower is located adjacent to the City of Westminster Historic District.



Border of National Register District is indicated in blue; the City's water tower is located just outside.
